








BASEBALL







Game:	Binball
Number of Players:	Two or more players are needed for this game.
Equipment:	One bat, one baseball, one base, one glove and one recycling bin are needed to play this game.
Playing Field:	This game can be played in a backyard, park, or on any field.
Objective:	The object of this game is to field a hit ball and throw the ball into a prone recycling bin.

Game Description:

-  Place the base on the ground. It will serve as home base.
-  Place the recycle bin on its side just behind home base (where a baseball catcher would be), with the opening facing the fielder.
-  One player starts as the batter and the other as the fielder.
-  The batter stands at home base, tosses the ball in the air and hits it. The batter wants to hit the ball towards the fielder.
-  The fielder positions him or herself at a distance from the batter that is appropriate to the batter's hitting ability.
-  When the fielder fields a ball hit by the batter, he or she attempts to throw the ball into the recycling bin.
-  If the ball goes into the bin, it is an out for the batter. If the ball does not go in the bin or if the fielder commits an error (ex. drops a fly ball), a run is scored by the batter.

Guidelines/Modifications:

-  If there are more than two players, additional fielders and/or a pitcher can be added.
-  The number of innings and outs can be designated by players depending on time, abilities, etc.
-  Additional bins can be placed as other bases and modifications to the game can be added.
-  Modified equipment can be used such as a whiffle bat and ball, tennis racquet and ball, etc. Various types of containers such as a garbage can, five-gallon bucket, etc. can be used in place of a recycling bin.
